





Silk Ribbon Butterfly Hanger

White Damask Psutterfly

Coathanger

Requirements

1 piece of Zweigart Papillon Damask (2434.170.100) 45 x 15cm

1 adult size wooden coathanger

10 x 150 cm of wadding for hanger white bias tape for hanger hook

4M of white 3mm double sided satin ribbon

1 M of pre-gathered white lace 5cm wide

1 M of white beading lace 15mm wide

#9~&10~DMC crewel needles, #~18 chenille needle

white sewing thread

1 skein each of DMC stranded

932, 3756, white, 524

Rayon R5200

White seed beads

1 card each of Bucilla Silk Ribbon

4mm #012, 7mm#126.

Use the photograph as a guide to design placement. Centre the <u>butterfly</u> and cut the coathanger pattern as per blue line diagram. 1. Following the square markings, embroider the pale blue **colonial knots** with six strands of 3756, the darker blue with 932.

- 2. Stitch the Carnation with 7mm #126 following diagram below. Stem stitch the stem and lazy daisy leaves in one strand of 524.
- 3. The **ribbon stitch** flowers use **4mm #012.** Hand stitch a straight stitch in the centre of each petal with 1 strand of 932 stranded cotton. Stitch a seed bead in the centre with two strands of **white stranded cotton**.
- 4.Sew the seed beads onto the butterflies body using two strands of white stranded cotton and the #10 needle.
- 5.Stitch the **lazy daisy flower** with all strands of the rayon 5200 using the #18 chenille needle. **Embroider** the colonial knots in the same thread for the vine. The centre of the daisy is one **colonial knot** using six strands of 932. Daisy leaves are one fly stitch with a centre straight stitch in one strand of 524. The vine leaves are 524 and a fly stitch around each knot.
- 6. The forget me knots are four colonial knots in six strands of 932 with a seed bead in the centre.
- 7.Overlock the botton of the Damask, sew the lace to this edge and thread the ribbon through the beading lace. Cover the hanger with the wadding, sew the bias strip over the hook, **sew** around the hanger edge 1.5cm in from the raw edge,leaving a small opening in the centre to push the hook through. Turn to the right side,slide over the hanger and sew the two bottom edges together. Cut the ribbon into **1M** lengths and tie a bow. **Hand sew** the bow in the centre of the hanger.


Threading the needle- Thread the ribbon through the needle & push the needle back through the end you have just threaded, about 4mm from the end. Pull the end of the ribbon until it knots at the eye of the needle.

Ending stitches.- Secure your stitches in place before beginning a new area. Do not drag the ribbon from one area to another.

Carnation-



Fold over the ends of the ribbon. With one strand of stranded cotton & a #9 needle run a running stitch along the bottom edge(dotted line). Leaving the end of the thread hanging, gather the ribbon in. With another strand of same colour cotton sew the ribbon onto the fabric in a circle starting from the inside and working out in a anti clockwise direction. When completed end the thread of and end of the original gathering thread as well.




Ribbon Stitch - 1.Bring your needle up at A, make sure the ribbon is flat. Push the needle into the centre of the ribbon 3-4 mm from A.

2.Carefully pull the needle & ribbon through as you will loose the loop if you pull too tight.




Lazy Daisy- 1.Needle up at A and down at B (this will form your loop), then up at C.

2. Needle down again very close to C to form your anchor stitch.



Fly Stitch -1. Needle up at A, down at B 2.& 3. Needle up at C, down at D. Anchor the loop with a small straight stitch.



Colonial Knot- Bring the needle up at A. Manipulate the needle to wrap the thread over, under, over and under the needle forming a figure '8'. Go back through the fabric at B (as cloes as possible to A). Keep the needle vertical while tightening the thread firmly around the needle. Hold the knot in place as you pull the thread through to the back.
